Important safety and handling information



To avoid personal injury, property damage, or accidental damage to your ThinkPad® Tablet 2 (hereafter referred to as the tablet), read all of the information in this section before using it.

For detailed operating instructions, refer to the *ThinkPad Tablet 2 User Guide* (this publication). You can access the *ThinkPad Tablet 2 User Guide* by using one of the following methods:

- Go to http://www.lenovo.com/UserManuals and follow the instructions on the screen.
- Start your tablet. Tap Lenovo Support on the Start screen. Then tap User Guide.
- Open Windows® Help and Support. Then tap Lenovo User Guide.

Handle your tablet with care:

Do not drop, bend, puncture, insert foreign objects, or place heavy objects on your tablet. Sensitive components inside might become damaged.

Your tablet screen is made of glass. The glass might break if the tablet is dropped on a hard surface, is the subject of a high impact, or is crushed by a heavy object. If the glass chips or cracks, do not touch the broken glass or attempt to remove it from the tablet. Stop using the tablet immediately and contact Lenovo® technical support for repair, replacement, or disposal information.

Do not disassemble or modify your tablet:

Your tablet is a sealed unit. There are no end-user serviceable parts inside. All internal repairs must be done by a Lenovo-authorized repair facility or a Lenovo-authorized technician. Attempting to open or modify your tablet will void the warranty.

Do not attempt to replace the internal battery:

Replacement of the internal rechargeable battery must be done by a Lenovo-authorized repair facility or a Lenovo-authorized technician. Lenovo-authorized repair facilities or technicians recycle Lenovo batteries according to local laws and regulations.

Prevent your tablet and adapter from getting wet:

Do not immerse your tablet in water or leave it in a location where it can get saturated with water or other liquids.

Use approved charging methods only:

You can use any of the following charging methods to safely recharge the internal battery of your tablet:

A USB connection between the dc-in connector on the tablet and a USB connector of a personal computer or other device that complies with the USB 2.0 standards (slowest charging method)	This charging method will compensate the power consumption. The battery will discharge more slowly than usual.	Approved, but the battery will charge slowly

Charging devices might become warm during normal use. Ensure that you have adequate ventilation around the charging device. Unplug the charging device if any of the following occurs:

- The charging device has been exposed to rain, liquid, or excessive moisture.
- The charging device shows signs of physical damage.
- You want to clean the charging device.

Lenovo is not responsible for the performance or safety of products not manufactured or approved by Lenovo.

Prevent hearing damage:

Your tablet has a headphone connector. Always use the headphone connector for headphones (also called a headset) or earphones.

CAUTION:

Excessive sound pressure from earphones and headphones can cause hearing loss. Adjustment of the equalizer to maximum increases the earphone and headphone output voltage and the sound pressure level. Therefore, to protect your hearing, adjust the equalizer to an appropriate level.

Excessive use of headphones or earphones for a long period of time at high volume can be dangerous if the output of the headphone or earphone connectors do not comply with specifications of EN 50332-2. The headphone output connector of your tablet complies with EN 50332-2 Sub clause 7. This specification limits the tablet's maximum wide band true RMS output voltage to 150 mV. To help protect against hearing loss, ensure that the headphones or earphones you use also comply with EN 50332-2 (Clause 7 limits) for a wide band characteristic voltage of 75 mV. Using headphones that do not comply with EN 50332-2 can be dangerous due to excessive sound pressure levels.

If your tablet came with headphones or earphones in the package, as a set, the combination of the headphones or earphones and the tablet already complies with the specifications of EN 50332-1. If different headphones or earphones are used, ensure that they comply with EN 50332-1 (Clause 6.5 Limitation Values). Using headphones that do not comply with EN 50332-1 can be dangerous due to excessive sound pressure levels.

Take care when using your tablet in a motor vehicle or on a bicycle:

Always prioritize your safety and the safety of others. Follow the law. Local laws and regulations might govern how you can use mobile electronic devices, such as your tablet, while you drive a motor vehicle or ride a bicycle.

Dispose according to local laws and regulations:

When your tablet reaches the end of its useful life, do not crush, incinerate, immerse in water, or dispose of your tablet in any manner contrary to local laws and regulations. Some internal parts contain substances that can explode, leak, or have an adverse environmental affect if disposed of incorrectly.

Keep your tablet and accessories away from small children:

Your tablet contains small parts that can be a choking hazard to small children. Additionally, the glass screen can break or crack if dropped on or thrown against a hard surface.

Protect your data and software:

Do not delete unknown files or change the name of files or directories that were not created by you; otherwise, your tablet software might fail to work.

Be aware that accessing network resources can leave your tablet vulnerable to computer viruses, hackers, spyware, and other malicious activities that might damage your tablet, software, or data. It is your responsibility to ensure that you have adequate protection in the form of firewalls, antivirus software, and anti-spyware software and keep this software up to date.

Keep electrical appliances such as an electric fan, radio, high-powered speakers, air conditioner, and microwave oven away from your tablet because the strong magnetic fields generated by these appliances can damage the screen and the data on the tablet.

Be aware of heat generated by your tablet:

When your tablet is turned on or the battery is charging, some parts might become hot. The temperature that they reach depends on the amount of system activity and the level of charge in the battery. Extended contact with your body, even through clothing, could cause discomfort or even a skin burn. Avoid keeping your hands, your lap, or any other part of your body in contact with a hot section of the tablet for any extended time.




Figure 1. ThinkPad Tablet 2 front and side view

1 Tablet Digitizer Pen storage

If your tablet is shipped with a Tablet Digitizer Pen or you have purchased one, use the storage slot to store it.

2 SIM-card slot

Open the cover to access the Subscriber Identification Module (SIM) card slot. Insert a SIM card to establish a wireless Wide Area Network (WAN) connection. For instructions on how to install the SIM card, see "Installing the SIM card" on page 13.

Note: The SIM-card slot is not functional on Wi-Fi-only models.

Micro SD card reader

Open the cover to access the micro SD card reader. Install a secure digital (SD) card into the micro SD media card reader for data access or storage. See "Using the micro SD card reader" on page 26 for more information.

4 Power button

Press the power button to turn on the tablet.

If your tablet stops responding and you cannot turn it off, press and hold the power button for four seconds or more.

5 Headphone or microphone connector

Connect headphones to the connector to listen to stereo sound from the tablet or connect a microphone to record audio or make calls. You also can connect a headset with an integrated microphone that uses a combined audio/microphone connector.

6 Volume control buttons

Press the volume up or down button to adjust the tablet volume.

7 Screen rotation lock button

Press the button to disable the screen auto-rotation function. Press again to enable it.

8 Mini HDMI™ connector

Your tablet has a mini high-definition multimedia interface (HDMI) connector, a digital audio and video interface that can connect a compatible digital audio device or video display such as a high definition television (HDTV). For more information, see "Using HDMI devices" on page 27.

9 ThinkPad Tablet 2 Dock connector

Use this connector to connect a ThinkPad Tablet 2 Dock. The ThinkPad Tablet 2 Dock is available as an option from Lenovo at http://www.lenovo.com/accessories/services/index.html. For more information, see "Using the ThinkPad Tablet 2 Dock" on page 34.

10 Emergency-reset hole

If your tablet stops responding and you cannot turn it off or turn it on by pressing and holding the power button, reset the tablet by inserting a straightened paper clip into the emergency-reset hole.

11 dc-in connector

You can use the supplied USB cable and the ac adapter to charge the tablet when the battery power is low. See "Charging the battery" on page 19.

12 USB connector

Open the USB connector cover to access the USB connector. Use the USB connector to connect a compatible USB device, such as a USB mouse, USB keyboard, or USB memory key. See "Using the USB connector" on page 25.

13 Front-facing camera

Your tablet has a 2-megapixel front-facing camera, which you can use to take pictures, create videos, or make video calls in collaboration with Web applications. For more information, see "Using the cameras" on page 24.

14 Ambient light sensor

The ambient light sensor detects the brightness of the environment. The screen brightness automatically adjusts depending on the ambient light conditions detected by the built-in ambient light sensor.

15 Windows button

Press the Windows button to go to the Start screen at any time.

16 Multi-touch screen

Tap the screen to use the controls on the screen including icons, menu items, and the onscreen keyboard. For more information, see "Using the multi-touch screen" on page 7.




Figure 2. ThinkPad Tablet 2 back-side view

1 Rear-facing camera with flash

Your tablet has an 8-megapixel rear-facing camera with an integrated flash, which you can use to take pictures and create videos. For more information, see "Using the cameras" on page 24.

2 Speakers

The integrated speakers provide audio output for video and music playback.

3 Microphone

The built-in microphone captures sound and voice when it is used with an application capable of handling audio.

4 Near-field-communication logo (on some models)

If your tablet comes with the near-field-communication (NFC) feature, the NFC logo is on the bottom cover.

Chapter 2. Getting started

This chapter helps you quickly start using your tablet.

Initial setup instructions

To use the tablet the first time after you take it out of the box, ensure that you follow the instructions below:

- 1. Use the supplied USB cable and ThinkPad Tablet AC Adapter to connect the tablet to an electrical outlet.
- 2. Press the power button to turn on the tablet.
- 3. Follow the onscreen instructions to complete the initial setup.

Using the multi-touch screen

This topic provides instructions on how to use the multi-touch screen.

Tap

Tap gently on the screen with your fingertip to launch an application, select an item, open a menu, or input text using the onscreen keyboard.

Press and hold

Press and hold an object or a blank area on the screen until an action occurs.

Drag

To move an item such as an image and an icon on the screen, tap and hold your finger on the item, move your finger to the desired location, and then take your finger off the screen.

Swipe or slide

Move your finger in a vertical or horizontal direction on the screen to scroll through the Start screen, Web pages, lists, picture thumbnails, and so on.

Zoom

- **Zoom out**: Move two fingers close together on the screen as if you are picking something up to reduce the view of an image or a Web page.
- Zoom in: Move two fingers apart on the screen to enlarge the view of an image or a Web page.

Double-tap

For some applications, quickly tap twice on the screen to zoom in. Double-tap again to zoom out.

Rotate the screen

Your tablet has a built-in motion sensor that supports the screen auto-rotation feature. By default, this feature is enabled. When you rotate the tablet, the screen automatically rotates to landscape or portrait view.

To disable the screen auto-rotation feature, press the screen rotation lock button.

Note: Some applications do not support the screen auto-rotation feature.

Touch gestures and mouse actions for Windows 8 and Windows 8.1 operating systems

The following table lists some touch gestures and the corresponding mouse actions supported by the Window 8 and Windows 8.1 operating systems.

Note: Your computer screen might look different from the following illustrations.

Using the onscreen keyboard

Use the onscreen keyboard to type text, numbers, symbols, and other characters. When you rotate the tablet, the onscreen keyboard automatically rotates to the corresponding portrait or landscape view.

To open the onscreen keyboard, do the following:

- Windows 8:
 - 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
 - 2. Tap the **Search** charm.
 - 3. Tap **App**.
 - 4. Tap On-Screen Keyboard.
- Windows 8.1:
 - 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
 - 2. Tap the **Search** charm to search for **On-Screen Keyboard**.
 - 3. Input On-Screen Keyboard.

To configure the input language, do the following:

- 1. Go to the desktop, and then swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
- 2. Tap the **Settings** charm.
- 3. Tap Control Panel → Clock, Language and Region.
- 4. Tap Change input methods. The Language windows opens.
- 5. Follow the onscreen instructions.

Using the touch keyboard and handwriting panel

Use the touch keyboard and hand writing panel to type text, numbers, symbols, and other characters as well as performing handwriting. When you rotate the tablet, the onscreen keyboard automatically rotates to the corresponding portrait or landscape view.

To open the touch keyboard and handwriting panel, do one of the following:

- On the Start screen, the touch keyboard and handwriting panel is displayed automatically anytime you need to type.
- On the Desktop, tap the keyboard icon to open it.

To configure the input language, do the following:

- 1. Go to the desktop, and then swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
- 2. Tap the **Settings** charm.
- 3. Tap Control Panel → Clock, Language and Region.
- 4. Tap Change input methods. The Language windows opens.
- 5. Follow the onscreen instructions.


Disabling the onscreen keyboard

If you prefer to use a physical keyboard, connect an external USB keyboard or pair a ThinkPad Tablet 2 Bluetooth Keyboard with Stand to your tablet. The onscreen keyboard is disabled automatically when you type from the physical keyboard.

Using the Tablet Digitizer Pen

The Tablet Digitizer Pen enables you to input text in a natural manner, as well as taking notes, annotating PDF files, and drawing graphics together with applications capable of editing and sketching.

Some tablets are equipped with a Tablet Digitizer Pen as a standard feature.



The Tablet Digitizer Pen consists of a tip 1 and a click button 2. Hold the pen and point the tip at the display to move the pointer.

To make a selection (single click), tap the display once with the pen. To double-click, tap twice without pausing. To do a right-click, tap the display once and then hold the tip of the pen on the display; the right-click icon appears.

Pressing the click button to take a screen capture and snip the captured image. For more information, see "Using the screen capture function" on page 25.

Checking for installed applications

To check for all of the installed applications, do the following:

- Windows 8: Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms. Then tap App without entering a search item.
- Windows 8.1: From the desktop, swipe up to the top edge of the screen.

The following table provides a brief introduction to some Lenovo applications that might be preinstalled on your tablet.

Note: Preinstalled Lenovo applications vary by geographic locations and are subject to change.

Downloading games and applications

To extend the functionality of your tablet, download and install additional applications from the Windows Store and Lenovo App Store. Both Microsoft Store and Lenovo App Store provide an easy and quick way for you to shop for games and mobile applications.

Downloading games and applications from the Windows Store

To download, buy an application, or a game from the Windows Store, do the following:

- 1. From the Start screen, tap Store.
- 2. Follow the onscreen instructions.

Downloading games and applications from Lenovo App Store

To download or buy an application or a game from Lenovo App Store, do the following:

- 1. From the Start screen, tap **Lenovo App Store**.
- 2. Scroll and browse listed applications or games to locate the desired application or game.
- 3. Tap the application or game, and then follow the instructions on the screen to download and install it.

Chapter 3. Wireless networks and devices

Your tablet can connect to a variety of networks and devices, including mobile networks (3G or 4G), Wi-Fi data networks, and Bluetooth devices.

Note: Some tablet models can connect to both mobile networks (3G or 4G) and Wi-Fi networks, while others can connect to Wi-Fi networks only. If your tablet supports Wi-Fi connection only, the information related to mobile networks does not apply to your tablet.

Installing the SIM card

If your tablet supports the mobile network connection, it might require a SIM card to connect to a mobile network. Depending on the country or region of delivery, the SIM card might be shipped with your tablet or you need to purchase one from the service carrier.

Attention: When installing or removing the SIM card, do not touch the SIM card metal connectors. As a precaution, always hold your tablet in your hand before you install or remove the SIM card to avoid electrostatic discharges.

To install a SIM card, do the following:


- 1. Turn off the tablet.
- 2. Open the SIM-card-slot cover and locate the SIM-card slot. To locate the SIM-card slot, see "Tablet layout" on page 1.
- 3. Hold the SIM card with the metal contacts facing down, and then insert it firmly into the SIM-card slot until you hear a click.



4. Close the SIM-card-slot cover and restart your tablet.

To remove the SIM card, do the following:

- 1. Turn off the tablet.
- 2. Open and hold the SIM-card-slot cover.
- 3. Push the SIM card inward until you hear a click 1. The SIM card ejects. Gently slide the SIM card out of the slot 2.



4. Close the SIM-card-slot cover and restart your tablet.

Determining which mobile network you are using

If you have connected to a network, you can check the network name to see which mobile network you are using.

To check the network name, do one of the following:

- Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms. Then tap the **Settings** charm. The network name is displayed under the network icon.
- On the desktop, move the pointer to the network icon in the Windows notification area. The network name is displayed.

Connecting to a mobile data network

A SIM card is required to connect to a mobile network. Refer to "Installing the SIM card" on page 13 for instructions on how to install a SIM card.

Note: Some tablets support access to Wi-Fi networks only. See "Connecting to a Wi-Fi network" on page 15 for instructions on connecting to a Wi-Fi network.

To connect to the mobile network, do the following:

- 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
- 2. Tap the Settings charm.
- 3. Tap the network icon. A list of available networks is displayed.
- 4. In the **Mobile broadband** section, slide to the right to turn it on.
- 5. Tap the network name. A menu is displayed.
- 6. Tap Connect.

When you are connected to the mobile data network, set the active mobile network as metered connection to reduce the amount of data you send and receive.

To set the active mobile network as metered connection, do the following:

- Windows 8:
 - 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
 - 2. Tap the **Settings** charm.
 - 3. Tap the network icon. A list of available Wi-Fi networks is displayed.
 - 4. Tap the Wi-Fi network name and hold your finger on the screen for two seconds. Then take your finger off the screen. A menu is displayed.
 - 5. Tap Set as metered connection.
- Windows 8.1:
 - 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
 - 2. Tap Settings → Change PC settings.
 - 3. In the navigation panel, tap **Network** → **Connections**.
 - 4. In the Mobile broadband section, tap the network name. A menu is displayed.
 - 5. In the **Set as a metered connection** section, slide to the right to turn it on.

After you set your mobile network as metered connection, you can disable the Download over metered connections feature to prevent extra charges.

To disable the Download over metered connections feature, do the following:

- Windows 8:
 - 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
 - 2. Tap the Settings charm.
 - 3. Tap Change PC settings.
 - 4. In the navigation panel, tap **Devices**.
 - 5. In the **Download over metered connections** section, slide to the left to turn it off.
- Windows 8.1:
 - 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
 - Tap Settings → Change PC settings.
 - In the navigation panel, tap PC and devices → Devices.
 - 4. In the **Download over metered connections** section, slide to the left to turn it off.

Connecting to a Wi-Fi network

Wi-Fi is a wireless networking technology that provides network access at distances of up to 100 meters (328 feet) depending on the Wi-Fi router and your surroundings. You can connect any ThinkPad Tablet 2 to a Wi-Fi network.

A Wi-Fi connection requires access to a functioning Wireless Access Point (WAP), also called a hotspot. Some hotspots are open to the public, but some others implement security features to limit access to specific groups or individuals.

Note: The range and quality of the Wi-Fi signal is affected by the number of connected devices, the infrastructure, and the objects through which the signal is transmitted.

Connecting to a Wi-Fi network

To establish a Wi-Fi network connection, do the following:

1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.

- 2. Tap the **Settings** charm.
- 3. Tap the network icon. A list of available Wi-Fi networks is displayed.
- 4. Tap the ID of the network you want to connect.
- 5. Follow the onscreen instructions to connect to the Wi-Fi network.

To view speed, security, address, and other information about the Wi-Fi network you are connected, tap its ID and hold your finger on the screen for two seconds. Then take your finger off the display. A menu is displayed. Select one of the menu items to view the information you need.

Your tablet supports the proxy feature for Wi-Fi connection. The proxy feature enables you to access more Web-based source and browse Internet more securely. If you want to configure the proxy settings when you are connecting to a Wi-Fi network, do the following:

- 1. Open the Internet options window. For information about how to open this window, see the Windows Help and Support program.
- 2. Tap the **Connections** tab.
- 3. Configure the proxy settings.

For more information about proxy settings, consult your IT administrators.

Adding a Wi-Fi network

If you want to access a Wi-Fi network that does not broadcast its network name (also called a service set identifier or SSID), you must add that Wi-Fi network before you can connect to it.

To add a Wi-Fi network, do the following:

Note: Ensure that Airplane mode is set to Off.

- 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
- 2. Tap the **Settings** charm.
- 3. Tap the network icon. A list of available Wi-Fi networks is displayed.
- 4. Tap **Hidden network**.
- 5. Follow the onscreen instructions to add a Wi-Fi network.

Adding a network profile

Each location profile stores all the network and Internet configuration settings needed for connecting to a network infrastructure from a specific location such as a home or an office. By switching between location profiles as you move your tablet from place to place, you can quickly and easily connect to a network with no need to reconfigure your settings manually and restart the tablet each time.

To add a network profile, do the following:

- 1. From the Start menu, tap **Lenovo Settings**.
- 2. Tap Location Awareness.
- 3. Follow the onscreen instructions to add a network profile.

Using Bluetooth devices

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communications technology. Use Bluetooth to establish a wireless connection with another Bluetooth-enabled device over a distance of about 10 m (32.8 ft), such as a ThinkPad Tablet 2 Bluetooth Keyboard with Stand or headset.

Pairing with a Bluetooth device

To connect and exchange data with another Bluetooth device, pair your tablet with the Bluetooth device by doing the following:

- Windows 8:
 - 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
 - 2. Tap the **Settings** charm.
 - 3. Tap Change PC settings.
 - 4. In the navigation panel, tap **Devices**.
 - 5. Tap Add a device.
 - 6. When the list of devices is displayed, tap the Bluetooth device you want to pair and follow the instructions on both devices to pair them. If the Bluetooth device is not displayed in the list, tap **Not finding what you are looking for?** and follow the instructions.
- Windows 8.1:
 - 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
 - 2. Tap the **Settings** charm.
 - 3. Tap Change PC settings.
 - 4. In the navigation panel, tap PC and devices, and then tap Bluetooth.
 - 5. When the list of devices is displayed, tap the Bluetooth device you want to pair, tap **Pair**, and then follow the instructions on both devices to pair them.

Unpairing a Bluetooth device

To unpair a Bluetooth device, do the following:

- Windows 8:
 - 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
 - 2. Tap the **Settings** charm.
 - 3. Tap Change PC settings.
 - 4. In the navigation panel, tap **Devices**.
 - 5. Tap the Bluetooth device you want to unpair.
 - 6. Tap the remove icon that is displayed to the right.
 - 7. Tap **Remove**.
- Windows 8.1:
 - 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
 - 2. Tap the Settings charm.
 - 3. Tap Change PC settings.
 - 4. In the navigation panel, tap **PC and devices**, and then tap **Bluetooth**.
 - 5. Tap the Bluetooth device you want to unpair.
 - 6. Tap Remove device.

Chapter 4. Battery and ac power

This chapter provides instructions on how to charge the battery, how to extend the battery life between charges, and how to view the battery status.

Charging the battery

Your tablet is shipped with an ac adapter to charge your tablet from any standard ac power outlet.

Note: The battery is not fully charged when shipped.

To charge the battery, do the following:

- 1. Plug the ac adapter into a standard ac power outlet.
- 2. Connect one end of the USB cable to the ac adapter and the other end to the dc-in connector on the tablet.



Figure 4. Connecting the ac adapter with the tablet

3. Disconnect the ac adapter from your tablet when the battery power is full, or leave the ac adapter connected to operate from ac power.

Alternatively, you can use any of the following charging methods to safely recharge the internal battery of your tablet:

Charging method	Tablet on (Display is on)	Tablet off or in screen lock mode (Display is off)
ThinkPad Tablet 2 Dock (fastest charging method)	Approved	Approved
ThinkPad Tablet AC Adapter	Approved, but the battery will charge slowly	Approved
A USB connection between the dc-in connector on the tablet and a USB connector of a personal computer or other device that complies with the USB 2.0 standards (slowest charging method)	This charging method will compensate the power consumption. The battery will discharge more slowly than usual.	Approved, but the battery will charge slowly

Attention: Use only Lenovo approved adapters. Unauthorized adapters could cause severe damage to your tablet.

Extending the battery life between charges

When you are traveling outdoors with your tablet and ac power is not available, you can extend the battery life by doing the following:

• Turn off Wi-Fi, mobile data network, and GPS when not in use.

To turn off the Wi-Fi, mobile data network, and GPS feature, do the following:

- 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
- 2. Tap the **Settings** charm.
- 3. Tap the network icon.
- 4. Slide to the right to turn on Airplane mode to disable all wireless devices.
- Turn off automatic synchronization for applications if you do not need them.

To turn off the automatic synchronization function, do the following:

- Windows 8:
 - 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
 - 2. Tap the Settings charm.
 - 3. Tap Change PC settings.
 - 4. In the navigation panel, tap Sync your settings.
 - 5. Switch off Sync your settings.
- Windows 8.1:
 - 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
 - 2. Tap the **Settings** charm.
 - 3. Tap Change PC settings.
 - 4. In the navigation panel, tap **SkyDrive**, and then tap **Sync settings**.
 - 5. Switch off Sync settings with SkyDrive.
- · Adjust the brightness of your screen.

To adjust the brightness of your screen, do the following:

- Windows 8:
 - 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
 - 2. Tap the **Settings** charm.
 - 3. Tap Brightness.
 - 4. Slide down to lower the brightness or slide up to increase the brightness.
- Windows 8.1:
 - 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
 - 2. Tap the **Settings** charm.
 - 3. Tap Screen.
 - 4. Slide down to lower the brightness or slide up to increase the brightness.
- Enter sleep mode when the tablet is temporarily not in use.

To enter sleep mode, do the following:

- 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
- 2. Tap the **Settings** charm.
- 3. Tap Power → Sleep.
- Turn off your tablet if you are not going to use it for a while.

To turn off your tablet, do the following:

- 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
- 2. Tap the **Settings** charm.
- 3. Tap Power → Shut down.

Checking the battery status

Get the approximate status of your battery at any time by checking the Desktop battery status icon on the taskbar.

To check for the accurate status and adjust your tablet power settings to achieve the best balance between performance and power saving, do the following:

- 1. From the Start screen, tap **Lenovo Settings** → **Power**.
- 2. Check your battery status and configure settings.

To check the battery status in Lenovo Support, do the following:

- 1. From the Start screen, tap Lenovo Support → System Health → Battery Health.
- 2. Check your battery status and configure settings.

Chapter 5. Using your tablet

This chapter provides instructions on how to use some basic applications and many of your tablet's features.

Changing the Windows 8.1 startup behavior to open either the desktop or the Start screen

On the Windows 8.1 operating system, you can set the computer to open either the desktop or the Start screen by default. To set the default startup screen, do the following:

- 1. On the desktop, tap and hold on the taskbar. A menu is displayed.
- 2. Tap **Properties**. The Taskbar and Navigation properties window is displayed.
- 3. On the Navigation tab, locate the Start screen section, and then do one of the following:
 - To set the desktop as your default startup screen, select When I sign in or close all apps on a screen, go to the desktop instead of Start so a check is visible.
 - To set the Start screen as your default startup screen, remove the check from the When I sign in or close all apps on the screen, go to desktop instead of Start checkbox.
- 4. Tap **OK** to save the new setting.

This feature is not available on the Windows 8 operating system.

Browsing the Internet

Use the browser to surf the Internet and search for information on the Web.

Note: If you choose to use a mobile data network, you might have to sign up for a data plan with your service carrier in your area. With some carriers, you can choose a data plan, track your data usage, and change or cancel your plan. With some plans you pay based on the amount of data used, while with other plans you pay a fixed fee for unlimited data use.

Some Web sites require you to enter a user name and password before you can gain access. The Password Manager program prompts you to store your logon information when you access a Web site. After the Password Manager program stores your logon information, it automatically logs you on the next time you access the Web site or application. For more information about the Password Manager program, see the help information system that comes with the program.

Using your tablet for entertainment

Use your tablet to take pictures and videos, listen to music, watch movies, and read books.

Using headphones or earphones

Your tablet has a headphone connector that you can use for a variety of listening devices such as headphones, earphones, and ear buds. Listening with the volume turned up too high for too long can lead to hearing loss. The symptoms of hearing damage might be progressive and not noticed at first.

Take the following precautions:

- 1. Limit the amount of time you use headphones, earphones, ear buds, or other devices that provide sound directly into your ears.
- 2. Avoid using high volume to block surrounding noise.

- 3. Decrease the volume if you are unable to hear people speaking around you.
- 4. To ensure that sound pressure levels do not exceed a safe level, use headphones, earphones, or ear buds that comply with EN 50332-2 (Clause 7 Limits).

Using the cameras

Your tablet has two cameras, a front-facing camera and a rear-facing camera. Each camera has an auto-focus feature that enables you to capture high-quality pictures and videos. The rear-facing camera comes with an integrated flash and includes a panorama mode that enables you to take a single image encompassing a wide range scene.

To launch a camera and configure the camera settings, do the following:

- 1. From the Start screen, tap **Lenovo Settings** → **Camera**.
- 2. Follow the onscreen instructions to configure settings and use the camera.

To switch between the front-facing camera and the rear-facing camera, do the following:

- Windows 8:
 - 1. From the Start screen, tap **Lenovo Settings** → **Camera**.
 - 2. In the View section, select Front Panel or Back Panel from the Select view drop-down list box to switch the cameras.
- Windows 8.1:
 - 1. From the Start screen, tap **Lenovo Settings** → **Camera**.
 - 2. In the View section, select Front-facing camera or Rear-facing camera from the Select a camera drop-down list box to switch the cameras.

You also can use the camera with other applications that provide features such as photographing, video capturing, and video conferencing. To download other applications, tap Lenovo App Store or Windows Store from the Start screen. Then follow the onscreen instructions.

Viewing pictures and watching videos

To view your photos, tap Photos from the Start screen. Photos stores all your pictures that you have taken with your camera, , as well as the ones you downloaded or copied from other sources.

To view your videos, tap **Video** from the Start screen. **Video** stores all your videos that you have taken with your camera, as well as the ones you downloaded or copied from other sources. It also provides videos that you might be interested in.

Listening to music

Your tablet is preinstalled with several online music applications. These applications enable you to listen to, download, or purchase music from the Web.

To listen to music stored on your tablet, do either of the following:

- Tap Music from the Start screen.
- Launch a preferred music application.

Reading books

To read online books and magazines, tap the application tile to open either the preinstalled e-book reader, or other e-book readers that you have downloaded from the Windows store.

If you want to read documents that are stored on your tablet, use the preinstalled Microsoft Office 2010 or Adobe Reader.

Working with Email

Use the Email application to read and send e-mails and manage all your e-mail accounts.

Using the screen capture function

The screen capture function makes it easy for you to save useful onscreen information and share images of what you see on the screen by taking screen captures.

You can use either the Windows Snipping Tool to capture the onscreen information. To open and use the Windows Snipping Tool, see the Windows Help and Support program.

Working with USB devices

You tablet has a dc-in connector and a USB connector to connect USB compatible devices. Read this topic to learn how to use each connector to connect different devices.

Using the dc-in connector

Use the dc-in connector together with the supplied USB cable to connect your tablet to the AC adapter to charge the tablet battery.

Note: The dc-in connector is for dc charge only.

Using the USB connector

Use the USB connector to connect a compatible USB device, such as a USB mouse, USB keyboard, or USB memory key. To locate the USB connector on your tablet, see "Tablet layout" on page 1.

Notes:

- The USB connector is compatible with the USB 2.0 standard.
- The USB connector can provide a maximum of 2.5 W power output.

Working with a USB keyboard or USB mouse

If you are accustomed to using a traditional physical keyboard, you can connect a USB keyboard to your tablet.

Keyboards can also be set up through the ThinkPad Tablet 2 Dock's USB connector and Lenovo offers both a ThinkPad USB Keyboard with TrackPoint® and a ThinkPad Edge wireless keyboard and mouse combo that can connect through this port. To purchase these options, go to http://www.lenovo.com/accessories/services/index.html.

For information about using a ThinkPad Tablet 2 Bluetooth Keyboard with Stand, see "Using the Bluetooth keyboard" on page 33.

You also can connect a USB mouse to the tablet. As soon as you connect a USB mouse to the tablet, a pointer is displayed on the tablet screen indicating that the mouse is activated and ready for use.

Using the micro SD card reader

Your tablet has a micro SD card reader.

To locate the micro SD card reader, see "Tablet layout" on page 1.

Inserting a micro SD card

Attention: Before handling a micro SD card, touch a metal table or a grounded metal object. This action reduces any static electricity from your body. Static electricity can damage the card.

To insert a micro SD card into the micro SD card reader, do the following:


- 1. Open the card reader cover and locate the micro SD card reader.
- 2. Make sure that the metal contacts of the card are facing down and pointing toward the tablet.
- 3. Insert the card firmly into the micro SD card reader until you hear a click. The card might stop before it is completely installed into the card reader.



Removing a flash media card

To remove a flash media card, do the following:

- 1. Open the slot cover.
- 2. Push the micro SD card inward a little until you hear a click; then, release it. The micro SD card pops out.
- 3. Gently slide the card out of the card reader.



Using HDMI devices

Your tablet has a mini HDMI connector that you can use to connect an external display for video output. To locate the mini HDMI connector, see "Tablet layout" on page 1.

To configure screen settings for the external display, do the following:

- 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display charms.
- 2. Tap the **Devices** charm.
- 3. Tap Second screen.
- 4. Tap to select a presentation scheme.

Using synchronization solutions

By using synchronization solutions, you can easily synchronize settings between your tablet and personal computer.

Synchronizing settings by using the Windows synchronization solution

To access Windows synchronization solution, do the following:

- Windows 8:
 - 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
 - 2. Tap the **Settings** charm.
 - 3. Tap the Change PC settings.
 - 4. In the navigation panel, tap Sync your settings.
 - 5. Configure settings as desired.
- Windows 8.1:
 - 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
 - 2. Tap the Settings charm.
 - 3. Tap the Change PC settings.
 - 4. In the navigation panel, tap **SkyDrive**, and then tap **Sync settings**.
 - 5. Configure settings as desired.

Synchronizing files by using the Lenovo Cloud solution

The Lenovo Cloud solution enables you to access, view, upload, or download massive resources, software, and information on a remote cloud server in a secured environment.

For more information about the Lenovo Cloud solution, go to http://www.lenovo.com/cloud.

Sharing your Internet connection

Note: This topic is only applicable for the Windows 8 operating system.

You can share your tablet's mobile data connection with a single computer through Wi-Fi tethering. You also can share your Internet connection with multiple devices at the same time by setting your tablet as a mobile hotspot.

Sharing your Internet connection by turning your tablet into a mobile hotspot

To share your Internet connection by turning your tablet into a mobile hotspot, do the following:

- 1. From the Start screen, tap **Lenovo Settings** → **Mobile Hotspot**.
- 2. In the Set up hotspot section, choose the network to share, create a name and a password for your mobile hotspot, and then select a security option.
- 3. Tap Start Sharing to turn your tablet into a mobile hotspot. Then other users can connect to your network by entering the correct mobile hotspot name and password.
- 4. In the Manage Users section, you can view users who are connected to your network in the drop-down list box.

Sharing your Internet connection using NFC

NFC is a wireless technology that enables you to establish radio communication between two devices by touching them together or bringing them into close proximity, usually no more than a few centimeters.

If your tablet is NFC-enabled, to invite and connect another NFC-enabled device to your hotspot, do the following:

- 1. From the Start screen, tap **Lenovo Settings** → **Mobile Hotspot**.
- 2. In the **Enable NFC** section, slide to the right to enable NFC.
- 3. Turn your tablet into a mobile hotspot. For more information, see "Sharing your Internet connection by turning your tablet into a mobile hotspot " on page 28.
- 4. Bring the two devices into very close proximity or touch them together.
- 5. If you want to direct the invited user to a Web site address when the user is connected to your hotspot, locate the Tap to Share section, select the check box next to the Web site address field, and fill in a Web site address into the field.

Note: The invited user will be directed to the defined Web site address when the user is connected to your hotspot.

6. In the **Tap to Share** section, tap the invitation message to send an invitation notification to the user you want to invite.

Note: The invited user must tap the invitation notification prompt within one minute to connect to your hotspot. Otherwise, you have to tap the invitation message to send the invitation notification again.

Using the GPS satellite receiver

Your tablet has a global positioning system (GPS) satellite receiver that enables you to pinpoint your location down to the street level. Use location-based applications such as Google Maps to find your current location, get directions to your destination, and find other location-based information.

Note: For longer battery life, disable the GPS satellite receiver when not in use.

Chapter 6. ThinkPad Tablet 2 options

Your tablet might come with a ThinkPad Tablet 2 Dock or a ThinkPad Tablet 2 Bluetooth Keyboard with Stand. If your tablet does not come with one, you can purchase one from Lenovo at http://www.lenovo.com/accessories/services/index.html.

The ThinkPad Tablet 2 Dock and the ThinkPad Tablet 2 Bluetooth Keyboard with Stand are option devices that Lenovo designed specifically for the ThinkPad Tablet. These options provide convenience and make your tablet easier to use for work, study, and entertainment.

ThinkPad Tablet 2 Bluetooth Keyboard with Stand

This topic gives an introduction to the ThinkPad Tablet 2 Bluetooth Keyboard with Stand (hereafter called Bluetooth keyboard).

1 Bluetooth keyboard

Works as a Bluetooth keyboard with optical TrackPoint and hot keys.

2 3 Optical TrackPoint

The optical TrackPoint is a cursor-positioning device that enables to you to point, select, drag and scroll without moving your fingers from a typing position.

For more information, see "Using the Bluetooth keyboard" on page 33.

4 Hot keys

The hot keys enable you to control many features of your tablet by pressing a single key. Refer to "Using the Bluetooth keyboard" on page 33 for more information.

5 Stand

The stand holds your tablet in an upright position.

ThinkPad Tablet 2 Dock

The ThinkPad Tablet 2 Dock (hereafter called the dock) holds your tablet in an upright position and frees your hands to do other tasks. It also provides you with easy access to connectors for USB devices, file transfers, charging, audio input, audio output, and video output.

1 Dock connector

This connector establishes the connection between the dock and tablet when your tablet is seated in the dock.

2 USB connector

Connect USB devices, such as a USB keyboard or a USB storage device.

Note: This connector is compatible with the USB 2.0 standard.




Figure 7. Dock rear view

1 HDMI connector

Connect a compatible digital audio device or video display.

2 Headphone connector

Connect a headphone or powered speakers to listen to the audio output.

3 Microphone connector

Connect a microphone to capture sound.

4 USB connectors

Connect compatible USB devices.

5 Ethernet connector

Connect your tablet to a LAN (10/100Mbps).

6 Power connector

Use the 65 W ac power adapter shipped with the dock to provide power to the tablet and charge the battery.

Using the Bluetooth keyboard

To use the Bluetooth keyboard, install your tablet into the keyboard first, as shown in the following illustration. Ensure that the tablet is secured in place.

Then, pair the Bluetooth keyboard with your tablet. See "Using Bluetooth devices" on page 16.

Note: To save battery power, turn off the Bluetooth keyboard when it is not in use. For information about how to turn off the Bluetooth feature, see "Extending the battery life between charges" on page 20.

Using the hot keys

The Bluetooth keyboard has several hot keys. Press a hot key to quickly control the associated function. To locate the hot keys, see "ThinkPad Tablet 2 Bluetooth Keyboard with Stand" on page 31.

Volume and mute control

- Speaker mute
- Speaker volume down
- Speaker volume up
- Microphone mute

Application control

- Open the Settings charm
- Open the **Search** charm
- View all applications

View all applications that you have opened

Screen control

- Brightness down
- Brightness up

Fn key control

Toggle the F1-F12 key functionality to use the keys in default mode or in legacy mode. In default mode, you can initiate the special functions illustrated on each key by tapping the corresponding key directly. In legacy mode, to initiate the special functions illustrated on each key, tap and hold the Fn key and then tap the desired function key, then release both keys.

Using the optical TrackPoint




Figure 9. Using the optical TrackPoint

The optical TrackPoint consists of a pointing sensor 1, two click buttons 2 4, and a center button 3. To move the pointer 5 on the screen, slide your finger tip across the top of the pointing sensor 1 in the direction in which you want the pointer to move. To select an item or open an application, put the pointer 5 on the desired item and press the left button 4. To open the menu for the current application, press the right button 2. To scroll Web pages or documents in any direction, press the center button 3 and slide your finger tip across the top of the pointing sensor.

For more information about the Bluetooth keyboard, refer to the documentation shipped with the Bluetooth keyboard.

Using the ThinkPad Tablet 2 Dock

This topic provides instructions on how to use the dock.

To connect your tablet to the dock, do the following:

1. Position your tablet with the dock connector side facing downward.

- 2. Align the dock connector on the tablet with the connector on the dock.
- 3. Gently slide your tablet into the dock until it is seated in place.

After the tablet is connected to the dock, you can:

- Use your tablet in an upright position without having to hold the tablet.
- Use the dock to hold your tablet upright when using an external USB keyboard.
- Connect the dock to your personal computer with the supplied USB cable to transfer files.
- Connect the dock to a stereo system or speakers using a stereo audio cable to play music.
- Connect the dock to an electrical outlet using the 65 W ac power adapter shipped with the dock to charge the tablet battery.

Chapter 7. Security

This chapter provides information about how to protect the information stored on your tablet.

Using passwords

By using passwords, you can help prevent your tablet from being used by others. Once you set a password, a prompt is displayed on the screen each time you turn on the tablet. Enter your password at the prompt. You cannot use the tablet unless you type the correct password.

Passwords and sleep mode

If you have set a Windows password and you put your tablet into sleep mode, you will be prompted to enter the password when resuming operation.

If you use your email address as a user account to sign in to Windows, enter your email password when resuming operation.

Supervisor password

If you have set a supervisor password in the ThinkPad Setup program, you are prompt to enter a supervisor password when you start the ThinkPad Setup program.

The supervisor password protects the system information stored in the ThinkPad Setup program. Without it, no one can change the configuration of the tablet.

Note: The system administrator can set the same supervisor password on many ThinkPad notebook tablets to make administration easier.

Setting, changing, or removing a supervisor password

Only a system administrator can set, change, or remove a supervisor password.

To set, change, or remove a supervisor password, do the following:

- 1. Print these instructions.
- 2. Save all open files, and exit all applications.
- 3. Turn your tablet off and then turn it on again.
- 4. When the logo screen is displayed, press the power button and the volume up button together. The ThinkPad Setup program main menu opens.
- 5. Tap **Security**.
- 6. Tap Password.
- 7. Tap **Supervisor Password**.
- 8. A window opens, prompting you to enter a new password. Depending on your needs, do one of the following:
 - To set a password, do the following:
 - a. Choose your supervisor password and type it in the Enter New Password field.
 - b. Tap the next line. Retype the password you just entered to verify it.
 - To change a password, do the following:
 - a. In the Enter Current Password field, type the current supervisor password.

- b. In the Enter New Password field, type the new supervisor password; then retype the password you just entered to verify it in the Confirm New Password field.
- To remove a password, do the following:
 - a. In the Enter Current Password field, type the current supervisor password.
 - b. Leave the Enter New Password and Confirm New Password fields blank.
- 9. Commit your password to memory. A Setup Notice window is displayed.

Attention: You might want to note down your password and keep it in a safe place. If you forget your supervisor password, Lenovo cannot reset your password. You must take your tablet to a Lenovo reseller or a Lenovo marketing representative to have the system board replaced. Proof of purchase is required, and a fee will be charged for parts and service.

10. Tap **Exit** to exit from the Setup Notice window.

The next time you open the ThinkPad Setup program, you will be prompted to type your password to proceed.

Setting the security chip

Strict security requirements are imposed on network client tablets that transfer confidential information electronically. Depending on the options you ordered, your tablet might have an embedded security chip, a cryptographic microprocessor.

Setting the security chip

The choices offered on the Security Chip submenu under the Security menu of the ThinkPad Setup program are the following:

- Security Chip Selection: select he security chip you want to use.
- **Security Chip**: activate, inactivate, or disable the security chip.
- Security Reporting Options: enable or disable each security reporting option.
- Clear Security Chip: clear the encryption key.
- · Physical Presence for Provisioning: enables or disables the confirmation message when you change the settings of the security chip.
- Physical Presence for Clear: enables or disables the confirmation message when you clear the security chip.

Notes:

- 1. Be sure that the supervisor password has been set in the ThinkPad Setup program. Otherwise anyone can change the settings for the security chip.
- 2. If the security chip is removed or replaced, or a new one has been added, the tablet will not start. You will hear four cycles of four beeps each.
- 3. If the security chip is inactive or disabled, the **Clear Security Chip** option will not be displayed.
- 4. When you clear the security chip, be sure to turn your tablet off and then turn it on again after you set the security chip to Active. Otherwise, the Clear Security Chip option is not displayed.

To set an item on the **Security Chip** submenu, do the following:

- 1. Print these instructions.
- 2. Save all open files, and exit all applications.
- 3. Turn your tablet off and then turn it on again.
- 4. When the logo screen is displayed, press power button together with the volume up button. The ThinkPad Setup program main menu opens.

- 5. Tap Security. The Security menu opens.
- 6. Tap Security Chip. The Security Chip submenu opens.
- 7. Tap an item you want to set. When the item is highlighted, tap the item.
- 8. Set other items that you want to set.
- 9. Tap Exit.

Using firewalls

If your system is preinstalled with a firewall program, it protects against tablet Internet security threats, unauthorized access, intrusions, and Internet attacks. It also protects your privacy.

For more information about how to use the firewall program, refer to the online help that comes with the program.

Protecting data against viruses

Your tablet is preinstalled with an antivirus program so you can detect and eliminate viruses. The antivirus program is designed to help you detect and eliminate viruses.

Lenovo provides a full version of antivirus software on your tablet with a free 30-day subscription. After 30 days, you must renew the license to continue receiving the antivirus software updates.

For more information about how to use your antivirus software, refer to the help system of your antivirus software.

Chapter 8. Recovery overview

This section provides information about the recovery solutions.

Refreshing your tablet

If your tablet does not perform well and the problem might be caused by a recently installed program, you can refresh your tablet without losing your personal files or changing your settings.

Attention: If you refresh your tablet, the programs that came with your tablet and the programs that you installed from Windows Store will be reinstalled, but all other programs will be removed.

To refresh your tablet, do the following:

- Windows 8:
 - 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
 - 2. Tap the Settings charm.
 - 3. Tap Change PC settings.
 - 4. Tap General.
 - 5. In the Refresh your PC without affecting your files section, tap Get started.
- Windows 8.1:
 - 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
 - 2. Tap the **Settings** charm.
 - 3. Tap Change PC settings.
 - 4. Tap **Update and recovery**, and then tap **Recovery**.
 - 5. In the Refresh your PC without affecting your files section, tap Get started.

Restoring your tablet to the factory default state

You can restore your tablet to the factory default state. Restore the tablet reinstalls the operating system, programs, and settings that came with your tablet.

Attention: When you restore your tablet, all your personal files and settings are deleted. To avoid data loss, make a backup copy of all the data that you want to keep before you restore your tablet.

To reset your tablet, do one the following:

- Using a USB recovery key provided by Lenovo (32 GB models only):
 - 1. Turn off the tablet, wait for about five seconds, and then insert the USB recovery key into the USB connector of your tablet.
 - 2. Press and hold the power button together with the volume up button at the same time to enter the ThinkPad Setup program.
 - 3. On the **Boot** submenu, select **CD/DVD: Generic Mass Storage**, and then tap "+/-" until the **CD/DVD: Generic Mass Storage** is shown as the first startup device.
 - 4. Insert the USB recovery key into the USB connector of your tablet.
 - Tap F10 to save the configuration change and exit ThinkPad Setup. The tablet restarts and the recovery program opens.
 - Depending on your needs, select the language you prefer in the drop-down list box. Click Next.

- 7. Follow the onscreen instructions.
- Using the recovery application provided by Microsoft (all models except 32 GB models):
 - Windows 8:
 - 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
 - 2. Tap Settings.
 - 3. Tap Change PC settings.
 - 4. Tap General.
 - 5. In the Remove everything and reinstall Windows section, tap Get started.
 - Windows 8.1:
 - 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
 - 2. Tap Settings.
 - 3. Tap Change PC settings.
 - 4. Tap **Update and recovery**, and then tap **Recovery**.
 - 5. In the Remove everything and reinstall Windows section, tap Get started.

For more information, see the Windows Help and Support program.

Advanced startup options

Advanced startup options enable you to change the startup settings of your Windows operating system, start the tablet from an external device, or restore the Windows operating system from a system image.

To use the advanced startup options, do the following:

- Windows 8:
 - 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
 - 2. Tap the **Settings** charm.
 - 3. Tap Change PC settings.
 - 4. Tap General.
 - 5. In the Advanced startup section, tap Restart now → Troubleshoot → Advanced options.
 - 6. Restart your tablet following the instructions on the screen.
- Windows 8.1:
 - 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
 - 2. Tap the **Settings** charm.
 - Tap Change PC settings.
 - 4. Tap **Update and recovery**, and then tap **Recovery**.
 - 5. In the Advanced startup section, tap Restart now → Troubleshoot → Advanced options.
 - 6. Restart your tablet following the instructions on the screen.

Installing device drivers

The device drivers are available at http://www.lenovo.com/ThinkPadDrivers. Click your tablet product name to view all the device drivers for your tablet.

Attention: Always go to http://www.lenovo.com/ThinkPadDrivers for the latest device drivers. Do not download them from the Windows Update Web site.

ThinkPad Setup

Your tablet comes with the ThinkPad Setup program to enable you to select various setup parameters.

To start the ThinkPad Setup program, do the following:

1. Turn on the tablet. When the logo screen is displayed, press the power button together with the volume up button at the same time. The ThinkPad Setup program main menu opens.

Note: If you have set a supervisor password, the ThinkPad Setup program main menu will be displayed after you enter the password. You can start the ThinkPad Setup program by tapping Enter instead of entering the supervisor password on the onscreen keyboard. However, you cannot change the parameters that are protected by the supervisor password.

- 2. Tap the item you want to change. When the item is highlighted, tap the item. A submenu is displayed.
- 3. Tap Esc to exit from the submenu.
- 4. If you are on a nested submenu, tap **Esc** repeatedly until you reach the ThinkPad Setup program main menu.

Note: If you need to restore the settings to their original state as of the time of purchase, tap **Default** to load the default settings. You also can tap an option on the Restart submenu to load the default settings or discard the changes.

5. Tap **Restart**. Tap the option you want for restarting your tablet, then tap **Enter**. Your tablet restarts.

Main menu

The **Main** menu is the first interface you see after you enter the ThinkPad Setup program. It displays the following configuration of your tablet:

Date and Time menu

If you need to set the current date and time of your tablet, tap **Date/Time** from the ThinkPad Setup menu. The following submenu is displayed:

- System Date
- System Time

To change the date and time, do the following:

- 1. Tap to select the item to change the date or time.
- 2. Tap to select a field.
- 3. Input the date or time.

Config menu

If you need to set the security features of your tablet, tap Config from the ThinkPad Setup menu.

The following table lists the **Config** menu items.

Startup menu

You might need to change the tablet startup settings. To do so, tap **Startup** from the ThinkPad Setup menu.

Attention:

- After you change your startup sequence, you must be extremely careful not to specify a wrong device during a copy, a save, or a format operation. If you specify a wrong device, your data and programs might be erased or overwritten.
- If you are using the BitLocker drive encryption, you should not change the startup sequence. BitLocker drive encryption detects the change of startup sequence and locks the tablet from booting.

Changing the startup sequence

To change the startup sequence, do the following:

- 1. Tap **Boot**. The default boot list is displayed, showing the order in which devices will be started up, even devices that are not attached to or installed on your tablet are listed.
- 2. In the **Boot** submenu, tap the menu item to specify the startup sequence that runs when you turn on the power.
- 3. Tap Save and Exit to save the changes and restart the system.

The following table lists the **Startup** menu items.

- In each submenu, tap the default value to show selectable options and select a desired option.
- Some items are displayed on the menu only if the tablet supports the corresponding features.

Restart menu

If you need to close the ThinkPad Setup and restart the system, select **Restart** from the ThinkPad Setup menu. The following submenu is displayed:

- Exit Saving Changes: Restart the system after saving the changes.
- Exit Discarding Changes: Restart the system without saving the changes.
- Load Setup Defaults: Load the default setting that was in effect at the time of purchase.
- **Discard Changes**: Discard the changes.
- Save Changes: Save the changes.

Updating your system UEFI BIOS

The Unified Extensible Firmware Interface (UEFI) BIOS is a part of the system programs that make up the basic layer of software built into your tablet. The UEFI BIOS translates the instructions from other software layers.

Your tablet system board has a module called EEPROM, also referred to as flash memory. You can update the UEFI BIOS and the ThinkPad Setup program by starting your tablet with a flash update optical disc or flash update application running in the Windows environment.

In some instances when you add software, hardware, or a device driver, you might be informed that you need to update your UEFI BIOS in order for the new addition to work properly.

To update your UEFI BIOS, go to the following Web site and follow the instructions on the screen: http://www.lenovo.com/ThinkPadDrivers

Using system management

This section is intended primarily for network administrators.

Your tablet is designed for manageability, so that you can redirect more of your resources to better meet your business objectives.

This manageability, or "Total Cost of Ownership" (TCO), enables you to remotely operate client tablets in the same way as you operate your own tablet, such as turning on a client tablet, formatting hard disk drive, and installing software.

Once the tablet is configured and operational, you can manage it by use of software and manageability features already integrated into the client system and the network.

System management

Read this topic to learn more about features of system management.

Desktop Management Interface

The system UEFI BIOS of your tablet supports an interface called System Management BIOS Reference Specification (SMBIOS) V2.6.1 SMBIOS provides information about the hardware components of your system. It is the responsibility of the BIOS to supply this database with information about itself and the devices on the system board. This specification documents the standards for getting access to this BIOS information.

Preboot eXecution Environment

Preboot eXecution Environment (PXE) technology makes your tablet more manageable (it is PXE 2.1-compliant) by enabling it to boot (load an operating system or another executable image) from a server. Your tablet supports the personal tablet functions that PXE requires. For example, with the appropriate LAN card, your tablet can be booted from the PXE server.

Note: Remote Program Load (RPL) cannot be used with your tablet.

Asset ID EEPROM

The Asset ID EEPROM contains information about the system, including its configuration and the serial numbers of key components. It also includes a number of blank fields in which you can record information about the end users in your network.

Setting management feature

Your network administrator can remotely update the system programs on your tablet from a management console. The following requirements must be met:

- Your tablet must be started over the LAN.
- Your tablet must be engaged in a Preboot eXecution Environment.
- Network-management software must be installed on the remote administrator's tablet.

Chapter 10. You and your tablet

This chapter provides the accessibility information about your tablet, and instructions on traveling with the tablet and maintaining the tablet.

Comfort and accessibility

Read this topic to learn how to use your tablet more comfortably and how to use the accessibility features.

Using your tablet more comfortably

With the help of all the conveniences and powerful features of your tablet, you can carry your tablet all day long for work or entertainment at many places. Therefore it is important that you remain attentive to good posture, good lighting, and proper seating to achieve greater comfort with your tablet.

Active sitting and rest breaks: The longer you sit and work with your tablet the more important it is to observe your working posture. Make minor voluntary postural changes and take frequent, short breaks when you use the tablet for a long time. Your tablet is a light and mobile system; remember that it can easily be repositioned to accommodate many posture modifications you might wish to make.

Work area setup options: Familiarize yourself with all of your office furniture so that you know how to adjust your work surface, seat, and other work tools to accommodate your preferences for comfort. If your work area is not in an office setting, be sure to take special note of employing active sitting and utilizing work breaks. Note that there are many ThinkPad product solutions available to help you modify and expand your tablet to best suit your needs. Access the Web site http://www.lenovo.com/accessories/services/index.html to view some of these options. Explore your options for docking solutions and external products that can provide the adjustability and features that you want.

Accessibility information

Accessibility technologies enable users that have hearing, vision, and mobility limitations to access information in the most appropriate way and get the most out of their tablet experience.

Zoom

Zoom in to enlarge the text size. To zoom in, tap the screen with two fingers and then slide them apart.

To reduce the text size, zoom out by dragging your fingers together.

Screen brightness

To set a screen brightness level that works for you, adjust the screen brightness.

Screen reader applications

Screen reader applications can read out software application interfaces, help systems, and a variety of online documents. If you need this feature, go to Windows Store or Lenovo App Store to download a screen reader application.

Getting updates

Your tablet enables you to update the Windows operating system and Lenovo applications.

Getting updates from Lenovo

Your tablet is preinstalled with System Update. This program enables you to keep the Lenovo software on your tablet up-to-date by downloading and installing software updates.

To start System Update, do the following:

- Windows 8:
 - 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
 - 2. Tap the Search charm.
 - 3. Tap **App**.
 - 4. Tap System Update.
 - 5. Follow the onscreen instructions.
- Windows 8.1:
 - 1. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
 - 2. Tap the **Search** charm and search for **System Update**.
 - 3. Tap System Update.
 - 4. Follow the onscreen instructions.

Getting updates from Microsoft

To check and keep your Windows, programs, or device drivers up-to-date, see the Windows Help and Support program for more information.

Traveling with your tablet

This topic provides information to help you work with and transport your tablet while you traveling.

Travel tips

Use the following travel tips to travel more confidently and efficiently with your tablet:

- 1. While it is safe to allow your tablet to go through the x ray machines at airport security stations, it is important to keep your eyes on the tablet at all times to prevent theft.
- 2. Put your tablet in a protective case when not in use to prevent damage or scratching.

Travel tips on airplanes

If you carry your tablet into an airplane, check the following travel tips:

- 1. If you are going to use the wireless service, check with the airline for any restrictions before boarding the airplane.
- 2. If there are restrictions on the use of tablets with the wireless feature on an airplane, enable the Airplane mode. To enable it, do the following:
 - a. Swipe in from the right edge of the screen to display the charms.
 - b. Tap the **Settings** charm.
 - c. Tap the network icon.
 - d. Slide to the right to turn on Airplane mode.
- 3. Be careful about the seat in front of you on the airplane. Place your tablet in a safe position so that it does not get caught when the person in front of you leans back.

Travel accessories

The following is a checklist of things to consider packing when you are going to be away from your office or home:

Travel essentials:

- The ThinkPad Tablet AC Adapter that comes with your tablet
- The supplied USB cable
- A quality carrying case that provides adequate cushion and protection

If you are traveling to another country or region, you might want to consider these items:

- A ThinkPad Tablet AC Adapter for the country to which you are traveling
- A SIM card for the local mobile services in that country or region

Other items you might want to consider:

- ThinkPad headphones
- Additional storage devices or flash media cards
- A ThinkPad Tablet AC Adapter if you are traveling by automobile
- ThinkPad Tablet 2 Bluetooth Keyboard with Stand

Care and maintenance

Handle your tablet with care so that you can enjoy this product for a long time.

Cleaning your tablet

To clean your tablet, unplug all cables and turn off the tablet by pressing and holding the power button for a few seconds. Then wipe the tablet screen with a soft, lint-free, dry cloth to clear stains and smudges.

Note: Do not use screen cleaners, household cleaners, aerosol sprays, solvents, alcohol, ammonia, or abrasives to clean your tablet.

Protecting the screen with a replaceable film

You can purchase a replaceable film to protect the screen from scratching and extend the life of your tablet. To use a replaceable film, clean the screen first and then apply the replaceable film on the screen.

Storing the tablet for extended periods

If you are not going to use your tablet for an extended period of time, remove the SIM card and the flash media card from your tablet, and then pack your tablet with a protective case and store it in a well-ventilated and dry area without direct exposure to sunshine.

Chapter 11. Troubleshooting problems

This chapter describes on what to do if you experience a problem with your tablet.

Troubleshooting

The problems and solutions described in this chapter are meant only as a guide. They are not definitive problem solving techniques. For some problems, you might need help from Lenovo, your reseller, or your service provider.

When you observe a problem, stop operation immediately, because taking further action might result in data loss or damage. Take a note of what the system is doing and what actions you performed before the problem occurred. Provide detailed information to Lenovo or your service provider for quicker problem resolution.

Internet problem

Problem: Unable to connect to the wireless network.

Suggested solution: Ensure that:

- The SIM card is valid and workable if you are using a mobile data network (3G or 4G).
- You are within the network's service range and the signal strength is good.
- Your tablet is not in Airplane mode.

If the problem persists, contact Lenovo for technical support.

Multi-touch screen problems

• **Problem**: The multi-touch screen responds slowly or improperly.

Suggested solution: Do the following:

- 1. Ensure that your hands are clean and dry when touching the screen.
- 2. Restart your tablet to try again.

If the problem persists, contact Lenovo for technical support.

Battery problem

Problem: The battery does not charge correctly.

Suggested solution: Check if the ac adapter is connected correctly. If the connection is good but the battery still does not charge, contact Lenovo to replace with a new battery.

System problems

• Problem: Unable to turn the tablet on.

Suggested solution: Connect your tablet to an ac power outlet using either a dock or the adapter through the provided USB cable to see if the problem is caused by a drained battery. If the problem persists, insert a straightened paper clip into the emergency-reset hole. To locate the emergency-reset hole, see "Tablet layout" on page 1. If the problem still persists, contact Lenovo for technical support.

Media problems

• **Problem**: The audio quality is poor or there is no sound output.

Suggested solution: Check and ensure that:

- The speaker is not covered.
- The speaker mute function is disabled.
- If you are using a headset, unplug it, then plug it in again.
- The volume is not turned to the lowest level.

If the problem persists, contact Lenovo for technical support.

• **Problem**: A song, video, or other media file cannot be played.

Suggested solution: Check and ensure that the media file is not corrupted.

External device connection problems

Problem: A connection is not established when you connect the tablet to a computer.

Suggested solution: Ensure that the computer USB cable you are using is the one that is shipped with your tablet.

• Problem: Bluetooth devices cannot be located.

Suggested solution: Ensure that:

- Your tablet Bluetooth is switched.
- The Bluetooth feature is activated on the device to which you want to connect.
- Your tablet and the Bluetooth device are within the maximum Bluetooth range (10 m).

If the problem persists, contact Lenovo for technical support.

Recovering from a severe software problem

If your tablet stops responding and you cannot turn off the tablet by pressing and holding the power button, insert a straightened paper clip into the emergency-reset hole to reset the tablet. Then restart your tablet. To locate the emergency-reset hole, see "Tablet layout" on page 1.

If you still encounter the same problem after you restart your tablet, reset your tablet and restart it again, you can perform a factory data reset operation. For more information, refer to "Restoring your tablet to the factory default state" on page 41.

Error messages

Message: 0177: Bad SVP data, stop POST task.

Solution: Checksum of the supervisor password in the EEPROM is not correct. The system board should be replaced. Have the tablet serviced.

Message: 0183: Bad CRC of Security Settings in EFI Variable. Enter ThinkPad Setup.

Solution: Checksum of the Security settings in the EFI Variable is not correct. Enter ThinkPad Setup to check Security settings, Press F10 and then press Enter to restart the system. If you still have a problem, have the tablet serviced.

Message: 0187: EAIA data access error

Solution: The access to EEPROM is failed. Have the tablet serviced.

Message: 0188: Invalid RFID Serialization Information Area.

Solution: The EEPROM checksum is not correct (block # 0 and 1). The system board should be replaced, and the box serial number needs to be reinstalled. Have the tablet serviced.

Message: 0189: Invalid RFID configuration information area

Solution: The EEPROM checksum is not correct (block # 4 and 5). The system board should be replaced, and the UUID needs to be reinstalled. Have the tablet serviced.

Message: 0190: Critical low-battery error

Solution: The tablet turned off, because the battery is low. Connect the ac adapter to the tablet and charge the battery.

Message: 0191: System Security - Invalid remote change requested.

Solution: The system configuration change has failed. Confirm the operation and try again. To clear the error, enter the ThinkPad Setup.

Message: 0199: System Security - Security password retry count exceeded.

Solution: This message is displayed if you enter a wrong supervisor password more than three times. Confirm the supervisor password and try again. To clear the error, enter the ThinkPad Setup.

Message: 2200: Machine Type and Serial Number are invalid.

Solution: Machine Type and Serial Number are invalid. Have the tablet serviced.

Message: 2201: Machine UUID is invalid.

Solution: Machine UUID is invalid. Have the tablet serviced.

Errors without messages

• Problem: My screen keeps blanking when I do not want it to.

Solution: You can disable any system timers, such as the LCD turn-off timer or the blank timer by doing the following:

- 1. Go the desktop and tap the battery-status icon in the Windows notification area.
- 2. Tap More power options → Show additional plans → High performance.
- **Problem**: When I turn on the tablet, nothing is displayed on the screen and the tablet does not beep while starting up.

Note: If you are not sure whether you heard any beeps, turn off the tablet by pressing and holding the power button for four seconds or more. Turn it on and listen again.

Solution: Ensure that:

- The ac power adapter is connected to the tablet and the power cord is plugged into a working electrical outlet.
- The tablet is turned on. (Turn the power button on again for confirmation.)

If these items are correctly set, and the screen remains blank, have the tablet serviced.

• **Problem**: When I turn on the tablet, only a white pointer is displayed on a blank screen.

Solution: If you have modified a partition on your solid state drive by using partition software, information about that partition, or the master boot record might have been destroyed.

- 1. Turn off the tablet, and then turn it on again.
- 2. If you still see only the pointer on the screen, do the following:
 - If you have used the partition software, examine the partition on the solid state drive by using the software, and recover the partition if required.
 - Use either the Rescue and Recovery workspace or the recovery discs to restore the system to the factory state.

If the problem persists, have the tablet serviced.

• Problem: My screen goes blank while the tablet is on.

Solution: Your screen saver or power management might have been enabled. Do either of the following:

- Touch the TrackPoint pointing device or the touch pad, or press a key to exit the screen saver.
- Press the power button to resume from sleep or hibernation mode.




Figure 12. Location of the UltraConnect wireless antennas
